On Friday 3<sup>rd</sup> October the circuit took 24 young people, aged from 8-17 years old to 3Generate, the Methodist Children and Youth Assembly. Hosted at the NEC, our Blackwater Valley children enjoyed a range of activities, worship, music and experiences.

Based around "The journey of a lifetime" our young people were able to play sports, make and create, worship, discuss topics which are important to them. Including performances from Folk On to making your own music, the young people were able to engage with faith on their terms. Not only that, they also are given the opportunity to vote for the next Youth President. (Results to be announced). Our under 8's didn't miss out either, as they had their own venue for the Saturday, where they played, sang, danced, created and explored faith with their parents or a significant adult. Clara said she didn't want to go home! And it's not just the young people who get a lot out of 3Gen. The leaders get to make memories with the young people, creating stronger bonds with them, which can be built on after the event.



Helen, one of the leaders said "The nice thing about 3Gen though is that even though is exhausting....its one of the places where im my favourite version of myself....and that aligning with the time with God is very restorative."

What then of the young people? When reflecting on what 3Generate means, one young person said "the event changes us, by making us better people learning from other people's experiences." I would encourage you, if you go to Fleet Methodist, The Church at the Pines or North Camp Methodist, why not talk to one of the young people was there, and find out what the impact has been?
