

Dear Friends,

With the turning on of the Christmas lights, the selling of trees, the decorating of homes, the writing of cards and the search for presents ongoing we enter the advent season with a sense of joy and anticipation.

With that in mind I have been instructed to put our tree up early this year as Luke and Mariel (son and daughter in law) will be arriving from Canada in mid-December for a fortnight – excitement and preparations are rising at the Manse!

Advent is a time of excitement and preparation, not only as we make our own plans as to how we celebrate the festive season but also as we relive the Christmas story.

One of the traditions we enjoy is the singing of Christmas carols. I was reading that carols began life as pagan songs sung at the winter solstice celebrations. The word carol means to 'dance or sing a joyful song. The early church replaced the solstice celebrations with Christmas and created songs with Christian lyrics instead.

'In AD129 a Roman bishop decreed that the song 'Angel's Hymn' should be sung at a Christmas service in Rome and this became one of the first carols known to us.'¹

I wonder what your favourite carol is - there are so many!

We might begin with 'Come thou long expected Jesus' – a hymn that echoes the longing felt by the Jewish people for their Messiah and Saviour to come – the Prince of Peace & Wonderful Counsellor.

'The Angel Gabriel from heaven came' may be difficult to sing, but it instantly reminds us of the visitor Mary encountered as a young woman being given the message that she would be the mother of our Lord - 'A most highly flavoured lady' as someone I know mispronounced it at a carol service!

I always love to include 'Tell out my soul the greatness of the Lord' – because it helps us to picture the song of Mary, known to many of us as the Magnificat. Sheer joy, despite the cost, at being the Lord's servant.

'O Little Town of Bethlehem' takes us right to the heart of the story and paints a rather idyllic picture of a starlit sky proclaiming the birth of Christ coming into an unsuspecting world, *'While mortal sleep, the angels keep their watch of wondering love.'*

The joy of that first Christmas leaps from the **Calypso Carol**:

O now carry me to Bethlehem, to see the Lord of love again; Just as poor as was the stable then, the Prince of Glory when he came.

Mary, angels & shepherds all rejoice at the birth of a newborn King.

As for a carol that always provokes a response from us, how can we not include 'In the bleak mid-winter'. Christina Georgina Rosesetti not only leads us to the manger scene where we find ourselves joining the nativity scene but finishes with a question:

What can I give him, poor as I am?

If I were a shepherd, I would bring a lamb.

If I were a wise man, I would do my part.

Yet what I can I give him – give my heart.

The anticipation and excitement of Christmas lead us to the manger where we can make our own heart felt response to God through which we can discover the hope, peace and joy that was promised all those years ago.

Have a wonderful Christmas season!


Church Family News


